### WELCOME TO THE 2010 FIRST-TIME PRINCIPALS PROGRAMME

Congratulations on your appointment as a Principal. Thank you for your recent enrolment in the First-time Principals Programme.

### FIRST-TIME PRINCIPALS PROGRAMME SUPPORT MATERIAL

Over the next eighteen months these dividers will enable you to collect and keep track of the material linked to the main components of the programme.

A great deal of our contact with you will be via the internet. It will make your job easier if you use the same divider headings for digital folders used to store and categorise information linked to the programme.

During the next eighteen months you will be developing a portfolio of evidence about your Principalship. It will be helpful to gather any digital portfolio items in a dedicated folder by using hyperlinks.

### ELP QUESTIONNAIRE

You are required to complete this online questionnaire **before** your mentor's first visit. It is accessed in the FTTP website under the 'Research' button on the blue left hand toolbar. When you have completed this questionnaire online, press the submit button. This will produce an automated email reply summarising your ELP responses. **Retain a copy for yourself and forward a copy to your mentor.**

### RESIDENTIAL COURSE ONE

Residential Course One *Starting Your Leadership* will be held in Auckland from **Wednesday 7th April to**

**Friday 9<sup>th</sup> April 2010 (3 days).** You will be sent detailed information about the course and arrangements (travel, accommodation, etc) well in advance. Dates of the second residential course are **Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> September to Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> September 2010 (2 days)** in Auckland.

## MENTORS

Each first-time principal is assigned a mentor who has been appointed from a rigorous selection process. They are all highly experienced school principals and trained in mentoring at The University of Auckland.

You will be informed once a mentor has been assigned to you and they will contact you promptly. This will begin the process of building a mentoring relationship and your use of their expertise. Your mentor will arrange the first mentoring activity (School Based Visit One) with you and meet you at your school. As well as regular email/telephone contact with your mentor, the mentoring activities include School Based Visits, Professional Learning Groups (PLG) and mentor support at residential courses.

## SCHOOL BASED VISIT ONE

Your mentor will first visit you at your school. In preparation for this visit, please ensure that you have:

- A private, quiet and uninterrupted space to meet and talk in.
- Identify a list of immediate issues that you wish to confidentially discuss with your mentor.
- Completed prior to the visit the online ELP (Educational Leadership Practices) questionnaire; emailed a copy to your mentor and have a copy available for discussion.
- Your ELP responses will identify the areas you feel that you need to further develop. These are your professional learning goals. You will work with your mentor to craft these goals into a Professional Learning Plan.

Your mentor will be available to you via phone, internet (email, Skype) and personal visits. **You should never hesitate to contact your mentor when you feel that you need their assistance.** If the situation is urgent and your mentor cannot be reached, please contact either John Locke (09)3737599 ext 82929 or Jacqui Patuawa (09) 3737599 ext 48399.

## POSTGRADUATE QUALIFICATIONS

Participants in the First-time Principals Programme in 2010 have the option of enrolling in one or two postgraduate courses in the Faculty of Education at the University of Auckland. The two courses are *Undertaking Research for School Improvement* and *Educational Leadership*. Each course is available either face-to-face or online. On confirmation of enrolment, participants can receive further information about these study options. The two courses are closely aligned to the curriculum and activities of the First-time Principals Programme.
